Conference Overview

HRI conferences, held every two years, are the highlight of the homeopathy research calendar. Venue

The conference will be held at the 5 star Radisson Blu Hotel Rome. It has 232 well-equipped bedrooms, a rooftop swimming pool, bar and restaurant and free wi-fi. The hotel is adjacent to Rome's Termini station with excellent access to the city and to Rome's airports.
